Family Engagement has a positive impact on a child's academic future. As a result, ELC of Duval works with providers and community partners to


ensure children benefit from a wide variety of programs and resources, including United Way's Born Learning parenting classes.





The ELC is thankful to the many volunteers who give their time to the Grow Up Great Children's Closet, located at Gateway to Heaven Christian Church. The Closet is open the first Friday of each month, thanks to sponsors: PNC Bank, Gateway to Heaven, Kid to Kid and Clothes 4 Souls.

The Closet assists people like Olgui Lopez, a first time mother, who had to quit her job based on a doctor's recommendation.







PNC supports our family engagement efforts in a wide variety of ways. Throughout the year, employees help sort clothes at the Grow Up Great Children's Closet, assemble bikes and wagons for children, assist with our book giveaways, sponsor events and much more!





In 2017-2018, the ELC of Duval held:
31 Parent Cafes, 92 Raising a Reader Sessions, 36 Born
Learning Parenting Classes, and assisted 378 families
(909 children) at the Grow Up Great Children's Closet.
153 volunteers donated 463 volunteer hours.

DEVELOPMENTAL HEALTH & INCLUSION

All children, ages 0-5, who participate in the **School Readiness program (SR)** and get financial assistance receive a developmental screening. ELC of Duval partners with the United Way of Northeast Florida and Florida's Help Me Grow (HMG) program to link families with a wide array of resources to address concerns about the health and development of their children.

The Kids Hope Alliance funds ELC of Duval through a Social Emotional Screenings and Behavioral Health Services Grant. This funding allows an inclusion specialist to administer a developmental screening (ASQ-SE 2) to school readiness and non-school readiness children, 1 month to 60-months of age.

In partnership with Lutheran Services Florida/Early Head Start (EHS), the ELC of Duval offers Ages and Stages (ASQ) kits and training to LSF Early Head Start Child Care partnership staff. The ELC of Duval also permits LSF to use the Help Me Grow system free of charge. This allows LSF to process and upload their screenings to a secure website.

SPOTLIGHT



It's called Books, Balls and Blocks! Periodically, throughout the year, the ELC holds this event to give free screenings to children, 4-months to 5-years-old. Children are screened for communication, behavior, cognitive, and gross and fine motor skills.

Guiding Stars of Duval is the Early Learning Coalition of Duval's quality rating improvement system (QRIS). It is a systematic approach to assess, improve, and communicate the level of quality in early and school-age care and education programs. Similar to rating systems for restaurants and hotels, Guiding Stars awards quality ratings to child care centers and family child care homes (FCCH) that meet a set of defined program standards, which include: teacher-child interactions, staff qualifications, child screening and assessments and professional development.

PRE-KINDERGARTEN


The **Voluntary Pre-Kindergarten (VPK)** program provides free pre-k to 4-year-olds living in Florida. This high-quality program equips children with the skills they need to enter kindergarten ready to succeed.



In 2017-2018, 401 child care providers offered free Voluntary Prekindergarten services to nearly 9,800 children.

EXCEPTIONAL FAMILY MEMBER



The Navy's **Exceptional Family Member (EFM)** program serves active military families who have a child with special needs. This program provides families 40-hours a month respite care at no charge. Jacksonville is one of only 5 homestead areas selected due to a large Navy population, a Navy

hospital, and remarkable resources and facilities for families. Each family selects their providers based on referrals from the ELC of Duval, who locates, trains, and refers providers to the EFM program.

CHILD CARE RESOURCE ERRAL







Child Care Resource & Referral (CCR&R) is the front door for early learning services at the ELC of Duval. CCR&R helps families enroll their children in Florida's VPK program, apply for child care assistance or apply for the United Way's Success by 6 scholarship program. CCR&R also connects families with community resources and information.

The **School Readiness (SR)** program enables incomeeligible families to work or attend school while ensuring their children are in safe, high-quality child care programs.

In 2017-2018, the ELC of Duval served over **11,600** children in **350** child care centers, **171** family child care homes and **65** private centers and schools.
