After reading the book above, we have included some activities below that you can explore with your children. **The Florida Early Learning Standard** is included so you will know what your child will be learning while exploring these activities.



Language and Literacy

IV.C.2.a. Uses increased vocabulary to describe objects, actions and events.

Put feathers and cotton balls in a shallow container. Have your children explore the different textures by rubbing it on their skin and asking them questions about how it feels and exploring words like soft, fluffy, etc.

Scientific Inquiry

IV.B.1.a. Explores, interacts with and identifies some plants and animals.

After reading the story, take your children outside and go on a scavenger hunt. Together, see how many birds you can identify that were in the story. Talk about the different colors of the birds, the sounds they make and where they may live.



Physical Development

I.C.1.a. Coordinates the use of hands and fingers



Use construction paper and feathers to make a bird. Cut out a big circle for the body and a small triangle for the beak with the construction paper. Next have your children glue feathers wherever they would like on their bird. Feel free to cut out different shapes and colors to create different kinds of birds.
