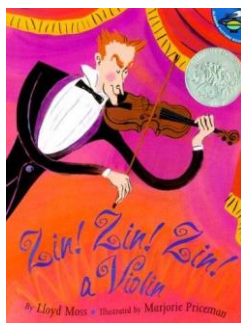


At Home Learning Activities
