

School Readiness (SR) Required Parent Copayment At-a-Glance

The Division of Early Learning (DEL) provides this side-by-side comparison of assessing parent copayments prior to July 1, 2025, and after July 1, 2025, to facilitate improved understanding of how procedures differ. Sliding fee scale (1)(a)	Early learning coalitions (ELCs) submit a sliding fee scale annually as an SR Plan amendment for DEL approval	DEL issues a sliding fee scale annually for ELCs to implement
Copayment threshold (1)(a)	Cannot exceed 10% of the family income	Cannot exceed 7% of the household income
Sibling discount (2)(a)	Optional, and set by the ELCs	None
Parent and provider notification (4)	Payment certificate includes copay due to each authorized provider for each enrollment	Payment certificate includes copay due to one authorized provider regardless of number of children receiving services or number of enrollments per household
Copayment collection (5)	- Each provider collects copay, unless waived, for each child and each enrollment - Deducted from the monthly reimbursement for each provider attended	- One provider collects the copay associated with one child and one enrollment, unless waived, within the household - Deducted from the monthly reimbursement for the provider that collects the copayment - Second and subsequent providers do not collect a copay and receive a full reimbursement
Accessibility of Copayment Information (11)	Not applicable	ELC must post a copy of the DEL issued sliding fee scale and DEL approved fee waiver policy in an easily accessible location on its website
